



Iclicker answers being in the slides that students could see ahead of time made for little incentive to actually think through the problem.

The purpose of these types of questions would be to remind students that the concepts we're studying are important in the real world.

- Sometimes the class would drag, making it difficult to concentrate.

- The homework assignments had way too much variability in difficulty. It would be fairly easy one week, then much more complicated the next. For example, the last two assignments for this semester are both twice as many questions as all the prior ones. Some questions also ask about course material in a much more complicated way than is approached in the lecture slides.
- The initial quizzes and homework difficulty was far greater than it should have been with almost all of the questions being abstract and requiring knowledge learned in later economics classes. Professor did quickly realize that and changed the difficulty and offered extra credit to help make up for the lost points.
